The first column identifies the type of expenses. The additional columns identify who is responsible for paying the expenses. The Episcopal Fund pays for "documented, approved" expenses according to *The Book of Discipline*, the Episcopal Fund Report No. 5, and the Travel Expense Guidelines. Additional documentation comes from the minutes of Council of Bishops and College of Bishops meetings.
